



This past season 80 clubs had an increase in membership in the BC/YT Section. The BC/YT Section membership increased by 3222 or 16% from the previous year. The Club who had the largest increase in membership by numbers is Coquitlam SC who increase their membership by 293 members. The Club who had the largest increase in membership by percentage is McBride SC who increase their membership by 983%. Congratulations to all clubs who increased their membership. We had 11 clubs participate in the Club Ranking with 4 Gold Clubs, 6 Silver Clubs, and 1 Bronze Club.

As another skating season ends, our Section can look back on the successes and accomplishments we have achieved over the past year.

Membership in the BC/YT Section continues to grow. This season saw our membership up 1060 to 23,221. An increase of 5% over last year's membership. 54% of the BC/YT Skating Clubs/Schools also saw an increase in membership.

With an increase in membership, meant an increase in services and programs for our clubs/skating schools and participants. The demand for coaching courses was like we have never seen before. In the 2023-2024 skating season, we held 11 Canskate Coaching Courses and 2 Regional Coaching Courses. We were also able to hold a Canskate Course in each of the five Regions to help meet the demand for trained coaches across the Section. To help with the demand for coaching courses, we have been training many new Learning Facilitators so that we can continue to meet the demand for Coaching Courses and get as many new coaches trained as quickly as possible.

This past season also saw the BC/YT Section host two Adult Skating Seminars. The first seminar was held in Vernon, BC on Saturday, March 16. There were 27 participants and the coaches were Kirsten Moore-Towers, Daniella Keller, and Cambria Little. The second seminar was held in Richmond, BC on Saturday, March 30. There were 52 participants and the coaches were Kirsten Moore-Towers, Mervin Tran, and Janet Lau. It was great to see so many adult skaters participating in the seminars, and we look forward to the Skate Canada Adult Seminar taking place July 11-13, 2024 in Burnaby.

Our skaters also saw many victories over the past season. For the first time in history, two BC/YT Section Senior Men finished 1-2 at the 2024 National Skating Championships. Wesley Chiu delivered two strong programs to stand atop the podium as the 2024 Canadian Senior Mens Champion. Teammate, Aleska Rakic finished right behind Wesley and claimed the silver medal. We also saw other National Medals won by BC/YT skaters. Chloe Nguyen and Brendan Giang won the Silver Medal in Junior Dance, David Li won the Silver Medal in Junior Men, Tasha Lai and Mickey Becker-Pos won the Bronze Medal in Novice Dance, and Alexander Ge won the Silver Medal in Pre Novice Men. We also saw another first this season, BC/YT placed 1-2 in the Pre Novice Pair Event at the 2023-2024 Skate Canada Challenge Pre Novice/Novice. Jaslynn Wong & Nico Conforti won the Gold Medal while teammates Ava Cheung and Stephen Lee won the Silver Medal.

Over the past couple of seasons, we have had the honour to be able to partner with Pascal Denis, coach of 3-time World Champions- Les Supremes. Pascal has been able to come out to Vancouver several times a year to work with the BC/YT Synchronized Skating Teams. This initiative has allowed our Synchronized Skating teams to improve their skills while receiving critical feedback from Pascal. Our teams all showed improvements this past season and we look forward to continuing this project again this year with Pascal.

We were also lucky enough to host 2023 Skate Canada International in Vancouver October 25-27 at UBC Thunderbird Sportsplex. We look forward to hosting everyone at the Skate Canada Ice Summit May 25-27 at the Sheraton Wall Centre. We encourage all clubs/skating schools and coaches to register and attend the Ice Summit weekend.

Of course, all these initiatives and projects would not be possible without the collaborative work of our skaters, coaches, officials, volunteers, and staff. I look forward to this upcoming season of new projects and initiatives to continue to service our BC/YT Section Skating Clubs/Schools and Participants.

The start of the 2023-2024 season saw the updated version of the Membership Manual posted to the skatinginbc website. You can find it listed under 'Clubs'. We encourage everyone to check out the Membership Manual as there are many topics addressed there that will help with the operations of a club. Mailouts that are sent to clubs are listed there and are available for all Club members to read.

One of the items listed under the Club tab was the nomination forms/link for the Skate Canada Awards that are presented every year at the Region, Section and National Level. A number of Regions had an increase in award packages sent in this year. I congratulate everyone for the effort put in to putting these packages together. I believe it is important to acknowledge, appreciate and congratulate skaters, volunteers and officials for all the time and hard work they put into this sport!

As of April 1, 2024 the BC/YT Section had 105 registered Clubs with a total membership of 23,221, an increase of 5% or 1060 members over last year. This years' membership is a five-year increase in the Section of 34%. (2019-17388 Members). We would like to welcome the

Ashcroft Academy of Skating in the Okanagan Region to the BC/YT Section.

#### Podium Pathway

The Quick Reference Guides for Singles, Pairs and Dance for the 2024-2025 season are posted on the Technical Page of the website. Of note this year is the absence of Junior and Senior requirements. It is anticipated that there may be changes accepted at the ISU Congress in June, so Skate Canada decided to wait on publication of the Junior/Senior Well Balanced Program requirements. Please note that there will be no changes to Skate Canada Novice and lower categories regardless of the results of Congress.

Feedback was received on the decision to remove the Pre-Juvenile category in BC competitions. As a result of a recent survey to all coaches in the province, we will once again include the Pre-Juvenile category beginning with Super Series BC SummerSkate.

Solo Dance will be implemented as a podium pathway event in the upcoming season beginning at th Novice level.

Alesksa had an excellent season with a 5th place finish at the Nebelhorn Trophy in Oberstdorf, Germany and a strong 8th place finish at the World Junior Figure Skating Championships in Taipei City, Taiwan.

Uliana Shiryaeva made waves on the national senior women's scene finishing a strong 4th at the National Championships in Calgary and Challenge Event in Winnipeg. Shiryaeva also placed 9th at the Junior Grand Prix event in Istanbul, Turkey.

Congratulations to David Li on his silver medal at the National Championships in Junior Men. Li had a string of top ten finishes on the ISU Junior Grand Prix this year and had the honour of representing Canada at the Youth Olympic Games in Gangwon, Korea, where he placed 10th.

Our Section continued to demonstrate strength in the discipline of ice Dance. Junior dancers Chloe Nguyen and Brendan Giang had an extremely successful season winning the National Silver medal, a silver medal at the ISU Junior Grand Prix Cup of Austria, and Gold at the Skate Canada Challenge event. The team finished the season with an excellent result at the World Junior Figure Skating Championships placing 6th.

Novice dancers Tasha Lai and Mickey Becker-Pos hit the national podium for a second year in a row winning the Bronze medal at Novice Nationals in Waterloo, Ontario and the Silver at Challenge.

Excellent results occurred in the discipline of pairs with a gold medal performance in Skate Challenge Pre-Novice Pairs by Jaslynn Wong and Nico Conforti. Teammates Ava Cheung and Stephen Lee captured the silver medal.

Thank you to team leaders Bev Viger, Haley Adams, Alex Clarke and Shelley Verhelst for supporting our skaters at the Challenge and National events.

#### Synchro

The Section continues to work on developing synchro at all levels. We are very fortunate to have Pascal Denis, team coach of the World Champions Les Supremes team, working with some of our teams on technical and choreographic aspects on their skating. Thank you to Hilary Quick and Section Office staff for their work on these synchro initiatives.

#### Camps

In June of 2023 we held the annual BC/YT Camp. This time, we held the camp in conjunction with a competition for the Pre-Novice to Senior levels. This allowed officials to be able to assess BC/YT team skater's programs in a competition environment as well as one-on-one. The always popular Kelowna Camp was held for STAR Skaters (STAR 4 and up) over the Easter Long weekend March 29-31, 2024. Skaters participated in a variety of on and off-ice activities. Thank you to the coaches who attended and help make this event such a memorable experience for the skaters.

This year, the goal of the CNCR was to invest money in our skaters, coaches, and officials by creating more opportunities for learning and development. At the forefront of this was an increased subsidy so that all three areas (North, West, and South/Central) could offer seminars with national-level facilitators open to all skaters in the region. Fort St John FSC welcomed in Emmanuel Sandhu and doubled their projected registration numbers, while Snow Valley SC in Kitimat and Prince George FSC, capitalized on the wealth of knowledge offered by Meaghan Duhamel and Zdenek Pazdirek, respectively. Creating these opportunities for our skaters was a huge success and one that we hope can continue in future years.

In addition to these amazing seminars, we were able to host one CanSkate coaching course in Smithers in September. While it had been our hope to do more for our potential coaches, we had some challenges coordinating moderators and our available ice. Given the considerable amount of interest in coaching, it is our goal to provide another course next season.

In terms of officials, a STAR 1-4 assessor clinic was conducted virtually in October for a handful of prospective officials from the CNCR and the Yukon. For the CNCR, we have three new STAR 1-4 assessor trainees who will be looking for more experience and promotion in the upcoming season. The ability to host these clinics in a virtual setting has been an asset to our region because it allows us to keep costs to a minimum rather than requiring candidates to travel great distances for a judging clinic. This has been a big step for our region which has been lacking officials for many years now and I'm excited for the potential that our officials' development has.

As the year progressed, our competitions were once again held successfully and our gratitude goes to the host clubs for all of their hard work.

Clubs were also able to host a number of assessment sessions – again in large part to the ability to do this in a virtual setting – and skaters were able to get some valuable feedback.

Overall, this year has proven to be a good year for growth and development. We hope to support our skaters, coaches, and officials, by providing more opportunities for them
