#### **NANAIMO SC**

As a former skater, and now a skating parent, it isn't hard to look around the ice sessions at our club and find inspiration. However, when it comes to inspiring, one young man on our ice stands separate from the rest. His name is Willson Poon. At first glance, he is just a nice young man working hard on his double jumps, trying to master that double axel. He is a student at Vancouver Island University, studying Tourism and Recreation, who has arranged his studies around his skating times. When Spring skating finishes, he will be heading off to his summer job, working at Disney Land.

But then when you look a little closer, you see that he isn't your average skater... I recently asked Willson about skating, and I knew I had to share his story... Here is what he had to say:

" My family moved to Canada when I was two, and grew up in Coquitlam. My dad got offered a job in Hong Kong when I was a teenager, and our family decided to relocate to Hong Kong. After a couple of years, I moved back to Canada and settled in Nanaimo, and started to learn skating at the age of 19. When I first started skating, I was told that 19 was the age when people start quitting or moving onto other things in their lives. However, I decided to continue learning to skate, as it gave me a goal, and also something to feel good and proud about.

I have been skating for almost 4 years now, I started off learning how to do a simple glide. Now I am able to fully rotate my Double-Axel. I schedule my University courses to fit in with my skating schedule. Every day, I go to school, then take the bus to skating practise, and then go to the gym to work-out. I do off-ice every other day, before I walk 20 minutes to get home.

When I was younger, I used to be a competitive swimmer and badminton player, therefore when I started skating, I worked extremely hard in hopes of becoming competitive one day. I finally met my goal this year, but sadly, new age limits that come into effect for Pre-Novice and Novice in July. In order for me to continue in the competitive track, I will have to compete in the Senior category. Knowing that that's my new goal, I will continue to work hard and push myself to be able to compete with the Seniors one day.

All goals can be met when you meet them with determination and hard work. When I started skating, my goal was to land an Axel, then a Double-Salchow. Now that I am almost landing my Double-

Axel, I will continue to work hard until I can one day land a Triple-Flip or hopefully Triple-Axel. I work hard and try to improve and master at least one jump per year, so by the end of this year, I should have landed my Double-Axel, and have started to work on Triple Jumps."

This spring, Wilson competed in the Pre Novice Men's category for the first time at the Barbara Rasmussen competition and then again at Super Series Vancouver Island.

In his spare time, Willson also works as a PA on our Canskate sessions, and he volunteers at the Nanaimo Multicultural Center.



#### 2012 WORLD FIGURE SKATING CHAMPIONSHIOPS-NICE FRANCE


NICE, France — Kevin Reynolds's double-barrelled challenge - skating for international respect, and for Canada - is not quite halfway done.

But he has shown that he is here at the world figure skating championships to fight for it.

The 21-year-old from Coquitlam, B.C., delivered a strong, nearly error-free short program as the seventh skater on the ice in the 30-man field Friday, worth a season's best 72.95 points, and opened some eyes with his development as a more polished stylist.

Always an extraordinary jumper, he didn't get full credit for rotating his opening quad-triple combination, but he fought hard to land both jumps, added a triple Axel and a triple Lutz and had

the crowd at the Palais des Exhibitions clapping along with his funky Chambermaid Swing program.



He's also ahead of 2011 world silver medallist Takahiko Kozuka and 2008 European champion Tomas Verner, among others.

"Wow," said Reynolds' coach, Joanne McLeod. "If they didn't downgrade that quad Salchow, it would have been another six points.

"He was just a little bit inside the circle (of the final revolution, on the landing), so he could have let it go. I was really proud of him for fighting through it."

"It felt a little bit borderline to me. It wasn't one of my best (quads)," said Reynolds. "I was a bit nervous at the start of the program, but I got into the performance as it went along."

"He's come a long way, hopefully you can tell, with the music and the movement and energy, which he has been deficient at," said McLeod, "and to hear the audience all with him in the performance makes me feel he's a complete skater now."

"Slowly but surely," Reynolds said. "I feel it's improving but it's still a ways to go. Hopefully by 2014 I can be up there in components with the best skaters in the world."



#### PRIMARY JUDGING CLINIC

Last month a Primary Judging Clinic was held in BC that was different than any other. The BC Coast region had not run a Primary clinic in some time, and there was a great need to provide one. We had a tremendous response, and 12 participants signed up. Our goal was to create an environment for new judges that was as close to a real competition as possible. We wanted new judges to experience the computers as part of their training. When discussing how to stage the clinic at the region board level, we tossed around the idea of doing a live simulation at one of our local clubs instead of running a clinic the traditional way at a competition. That way, the clinic participants were able to get a true competition environment without the stress of an actual competition, plus were not adding additional pressure to any competition organizing committee. We approached the Connaught SC, and they were excited to partner in this venture. We were lucky to be able to host the event at the Richmond Olympic Oval, a truly inspiring venue. Once we realized the magnitude of what were were trying to accomplish, we realized it would be similar to planning a competition, and much more than a traditional judging clinic. We had to secure a tech panel (Vanessa Hunter, Darryl Lampitt, and Ethan Swinburnson) and a data specialist team (Wayne Sutherland and Sharon Dahl). Kevin Gordon, the president of the Connaught SC, enlisted a small group of club volunteers to help him with judges stand construction, music playing, announcing, and ice captains. Also, we enlisted Marg Warwick to help feed all of our volunteers and clinic participants.

The other task was to tread the "overwhelm factor". With a poor retention rate in the past, judging clinics were missing the mark. One of the key areas identified was content overload. While wanting to provide the participants with as real a simulation as possible, we still had to juggle the amount of info that we would be asking the participants to digest. Therefore, it was identified early on that this clinic was not a task for one person.

During the simulation we broke the group up into three sub groups. Each group went to different stations to work on different skills. One group worked with Amie Garras and Joanne Brandon on the computer entering their GOE's for each skater. There was a "panel" of judes, and the ratio of teacher to student





was 2 to 1. This was important, as there was a major difference in the speed of acquisition of this brand new skill. Different scenarios were put into place by Wayne (our data specialist) to give the participants real world examples of what could hap pen. Another group worked with Hilary Quick on Program Components. The participants looked at key PC points, and terminology was introduced while skaters were performing live. Finally, Kortney Story assisted by providing the Skill ID component where the participants put pen to paper and were asked to correctly identify elements as they were completed in the skater's programs. These exercises were all done to help breakdown the different elements of the judging process.

As a developing idea took shape, a on-ice Skating Skills demonstration led by Keegan Murphy, Director of Skating Programs, was constructed prior to the clinic. Keegan was extremely enthusiastic in working with our new judges to provide a coaches perspective on an important component of our sport which is how to evaluate Skating Skills. He provided live skaters, from his stock of champions, and pointed out what to look for in assessing skating skills and the importance of developing these skills at the earliest levels. He brought five demonstrators out onto the ice, ranging in levels from Pre-Preliminary to Senior. All five skaters would complete the same stroking exercise, while Keegan spoke of the key differences in development. From there, we saw each skater individually demonstrating their step sequences. All the while, he was commenting on different qualities to look for while evaluating the skill level of the skater. Providing the live demonstration, we were lucky to have Mitchell Gordon (Senior Men), Shawn Cuevas (Junior Men), Amanda Feltham (Pre-Novice Women), Alisa Catsuno (Pre-Juvenile), and Samantha Yeung (Pre-Preliminary Ladies). What the clinic participants were able to see was the progression of skating skills, and how that skill impacted elements such as step sequences. Joanne and Keegan would point out the relationship between the quality of the skaters and the gradations that they would accordingly be marked at. While Keegan spoke for the coaches perspective, the language was reshaped by Joanne and "judging language" was reinforced as the skaters were performing live. The importance of the relationship between coaches and judges was a by-product of

this live, on-ice session. In the afternoon, we had classroom time to debrief our busy morning. Time was taken to really dive into the judging process, with sections devoted to both GOE's and PC's. For GOE's, archived footage from the most recent Super Series Competition was used. Two different skaters from the same Preliminary group were shown via projector, and each candidate evaluated just the GOE's. Amie and Joanne also "judged" along with the participants, and placed their GOE's on the flipchart paper and discussion was held. Different viewpoints were established and validated, and the same program was watched again. Further discussion was had, and the light of recognition could be seen in almost all of the participants. They were able to see the "formula" by which we arrive at the final GOE, and in the safe classroom environment, were able to toss around their own ideas. For Program Components, each individual component for this level was discussed by Hilary. Each component was broken down into the key words that need to be assessed. Videos again were used, and the candidates were encouraged to use their "key words" to describe what they were seeing on the screen. Again, lightbulbs began going off, one by one, as it became apparent that there really is a method to the maddness! Shorthand was also something that naturally eminated from all of the classroom discussion. Candidates were encourage to start their own shorthand "key" that should be expanded and practiced at home through the use of YouTube judging etc.

Another important part of the clinic was discussing the different streams of being a Skate Canada official All volunteer avenuse were discussed - judge, evaluator, data specialist, and technical specialist. Many

officials dedicate countless hours to the

sport at competitions, test days, simulations, and self-guided learning. The question was put to the participants: How much time do you think you can com mit and what are your goals as a SC volunteer? One of the

failings of the "old way of doing things" is to limit the ways in which a person can join the SC group of volunteers. The participants were encouraged to think about what they would like to achieve both in the short and long term. The goal of the clinic moderator should be to help guide the participants through this process, and provide ongoing mentorship. This was a great adventure for both of us as new moderators. We learned so much about how to plan such a large event. This could not have happened with out the help of such a great team of volunteers and the fantastic support of the BC Coast Region. We look forward to continuing to help out this new group of judges and many other groups to come!



#### ACCREDITATION FOR EVENTS POLICY REMINDER

As Skate Canada moves forward with the competitive re-structure, the Accreditation for Events Policy will also be undergoing a few changes. Several changes in the Accreditation for Events Policy will impact coaches.

Pre-juvenile sectional events: As of July 1, 2011, all coaches attending pre-juvenile events at a sectional event must be Intermediate STARSkate / Provincial Coach (IS/PC) certified.

Canadian Championships: As of July 1, 2012, all coaches attending this event will be required to be NCCP Level 3 certified. This means that coaches of Novice, Junior and Senior level competitors will have to meet this standard prior to Canadians in January 2013.

Canadian Synchronized Skating Championships: As of July 1, 2013, all coaches attending this event must be NCCP Level 3 certified. This means that coaches of Novice, Intermediate, Junior, Senior or Open teams must be NCCP Level 3 certified prior to the Synchronized Skating Championships in 2014.

We have communicated these changes with the Section Offices and have requested they assist where possible in providing the relevant NCCP technical courses. Please contact your local office for a list of courses in your area.

Please keep the above mentioned certification requirements in mind to ensure that you have achieved the necessary certification level to attend the events with your athletes. If you have any questions please contact coaching&programs@skatecanada.ca


#### **Riley Buckner**


