





This season the timeline for the Club Ranking will be April 1, 2015 to March 31, 2016. There will be an overlap with some items that you may have used for this past years ranking and this coming years rankings. For instance, attendance at the 2015 Section AGM gave you points last year and you can also claim points for that same AGM attendance for this year.

Below is the criteria and point rankings for this season. Each year the criteria may vary depending upon what the Section feels Clubs should be focusing on. This year the largest "points" will be given to Clubs that Increase their Club Membership. The form to be completed online will be available on the BC/YK website April 1st, 2016. This form must be completed by April 15, 2015.

Results will be announced at the 2016 Section AGM. The results will give Clubs either a Bronze, Silver, Gold, or Platinum ranking. Clubs will be emailed a certificate stating the ranking that they have achieved. This certificate may be posted in your arena. The list of Clubs will also be posted on our www.skatinginbc.com website, and published in Thin Ice. Good Luck to All Clubs!






